

One of his other key activities in a busy retirement has been to write his life story.

Idea Corner: Emory Emeritus College Interdisciplinary Seminars

In the spring of 2014 Emory's Emeritus College mounted two seminars that offered its members an opportunity to engage in a sustained and wide-ranging discussion of serious intellectual issues arising from a focus on a single, mutually agreed-upon topic.

One of these seminars chose to center on <u>"The Nature of Evidence;"</u> it explored both similarities and differences in how various academic disciplines orient themselves toward the search for truth. As John Bugge, the seminar convener, noted, "What constitutes evidence in the law or sociology is necessarily quite different from what it is in physics or nursing, literary criticism or history, philosophy or chemistry. Our kaleidoscope of disciplinary perspectives turned out to be illuminating for all."

This fall another seminar is scheduled, with the tentative title of "Higher Education in Crisis." Its focus will be on national trends posing fundamental challenges to the institution that so many retired faculty helped to nurture and promote during their active tenure. It is hoped the seminar will generate a number of well-considered policy suggestions for the University Senate, President, and Board of Trustees.
